

SUBJECT: Committee meeting of EAC Life Members; to determine criteria for new Life Members

Per the request of the 2022 incoming club President, a committee meeting of the above EAC life members discussed the criteria for becoming a life member of the Elko Archery Club. All present agreed that becoming a life member should not be a simple “check the box” application process. An individual should demonstrate a selfless interest and dedication to the archery club. The individual should be someone that participates not only in tournaments but is actively involved in other aspects of the club. Examples include but are not limited to the following; participating in work parties, shoot set-up and clean-up, procuring donations, being on the Board of Directors, attending club meetings, etc.

The following criteria are their recommendations to become a life member.

1. The individual must be an Elko Archery Club member, in good standing, with at least ten (10) years of club membership.
2. The individual must be nominated by another current club member that is also in good standing with the club.
3. The club President, in office at time of the nomination, shall present the proposed nomination to the committee Chairperson of current life members. The President shall communicate directly with the current Chair person, who will then communicate with the Life member committee to set up a meeting with date and time. The Chairperson will then inform the current Club President of the date and time of the meeting. The President will officiate the meeting and may only be a tie breaker vote in the event of an even vote.
4. The club member that proposed the nomination may also be present at this meeting to clarify and discuss why the nominee should be made a life member of the Elko Archery Club.

5. The committee of life members must have no less than three (3) members present at the nomination meeting. To avoid a potential deadlock there should always be an odd number of life members during the voting process.

6. The club member that proposed the nomination will not be part of the voting process. Once the nominating club member has clarified and discussed the reason for their nomination, they will leave the voting forum.
